In 2022, construction work began on the Kigoma-Butare-Ngozi-Gitega High Voltage Power Line to connect the electricity grid of Rwanda and Burundi, strengthening the bilateral electricity trade ...

The substation will strengthen the reliability and stability of the electricity network in Bujumbura, the economic capital of Burundi, and will improve its flexibility of use.

The project aims to improve effective electricity supply by reducing energy losses and undistributed energy following the reinforcement of medium/low voltage substations.

Scheduled for completion in December 2024, the substation will be the injection point for energy produced by the Ruzizi III regional hydroelectric power station, which is also receiving funding ...
